## Propagation Procedure

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of #1099 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a slant, and/or plate.
5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 26°C for two to three weeks.

## Notes

Growth on solid medium is indicated by the formation of small, white, entire, smooth, glistening colonies.

The pH of the medium should be checked when cool, and is most critical. Unbuffered medium should not be used. Exposure of medium to light, particularly when hot, may also result in the accumulation of peroxides that can be inhibitory to the bacteria.

Before rehydration, vials may be stored at +2 to +8°C for extended periods with minimal loss of viability. Subculturing to maintain culture is discouraged because of the possibility of mutation, selection of variants, or contamination. To minimize changes, it is recommended that cells be harvested and stored at ≤70°C or below.

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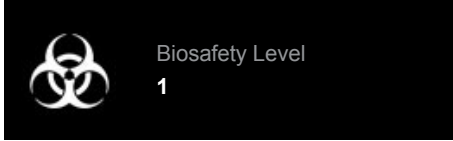
