High molecular weight DNA, appropriate for polymerase chain reaction (PCR)\* process and other molecular biology applications.

### Quality Control Information

#### QUALITY CONTROL INFORMATION:

1. DNA samples have been aseptically air-dried and are shipped at ambient temperature. Store at 4 °C upon receipt to prevent degradation.
2. Integrity of DNA and presence of RNA contamination is determined by visualization on 0.5% agarose gels post-stained with ethidium bromide.
3. DNA is digested with BamHI to test for suitability for a standard restriction endonuclease reaction.
4. Based on electrophoretic analysis on a 0.5% agarose gel alongside a High molecular weight ladder, the molecular weight was found to be >48 kilobase pairs.
5. No RNA is detectable by electrophoresis.
6. Rehydration may be accomplished to the level of 100-250 ug/ml using TE buffer (containing 10 mM TRIS and 1 mM EDTA, pH 7.5).

\* The polymerase chain reaction (PCR) process is covered by patents owned by Hoffmann-La Roche Inc. Use of the PCR process requires a license.
