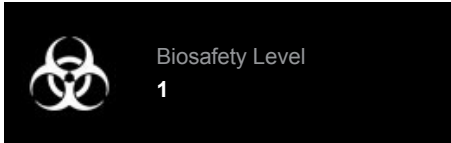

### SAFETY PRECAUTION

ATCC highly recommends that protective gloves and clothing always be used and a full face mask always be worn when handling frozen vials. It is important to note that some vials leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vessel exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris.

### Unpacking & Storage Instructions

1. Check all containers for leakage or breakage.
2. Remove the frozen cells from the dry ice packaging and immediately place the cells at a temperature below  $-130^{\circ}\text{C}$ , preferably in liquid nitrogen vapor, until ready for use.

### Comments

An EcoRI/HindIII double digest will give a 7.4 kb fragment of the vector retaining all the vector functions. The EcoRI site is just downstream of the yeast promoter.  
Restriction digests of the clone give the following sizes (kb): EcoRI--8.8; PstI--7.2, 1.6; HindIII--6.6, 2.2; XbaI--6.85, 1.95.
