SAFETY PRECAUTION

ATCC highly recommends that protective gloves and clothing always be used and a full face mask always be worn when handling frozen vials. It is important to note that some vials leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vessel exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris.

Unpacking & Storage Instructions

1. Check all containers for leakage or breakage.
2. Remove the frozen cells from the dry ice packaging and immediately place the cells at a temperature below -130°C , preferably in liquid nitrogen vapor, until ready for use.

Propagation

Complete Growth Medium

ATCC[®] Medium 20: J B medium with 0.2% glucose

Propagation Procedure

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of #20 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an additional broth, slant, and or plate.
5. Incubate tubes and plate at 26°C for 24 to 48 hours. Depositor states that the best colony formation occurs on plates dried 2 to 3 days prior to inoculation.

Notes

Colonies on #20 plates are entire, glistening, smooth, low convex, mottled, and slightly opaque.
