Propagation Procedure

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of #2 broth (5 to 6 mL), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 mL with a Pasteur or 1.0 mL pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #2 agar slant, and/or plate.
5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 30°C for 24 hours.

Notes

When using this strain as part of the "quorum sensing kit" or in any other bioluminescent assays, #2746 media should be used. Marine media contains boric acid and may cause otherwise bioluminescent-negative strains to luminesce, as boron is a key element in autoinducer-2.

Colonies on #2 agar appear smooth, entire, opaque, convex, and beige. This strain exhibits bioluminescence in #2746 media.

BAA-1121 has the following genotype: luxN::Cm^R, luxS::Tn5Kan.
