Monoclonal antibodies are listed by antigen-specificity, as opposed to immunogen. PTY 3 recognizes a potyvirus group-common, non-virion surface-located, conformation-independent, trypsin-resistant-core protein epitope located on at least 15 of 30 tested potyviruses, including but not necessarily limited to: bean yellow mosaic, clover yellow vein, pea mosaic, pepper mottle, tobacco vein mottling, sugarcane mosaic, maize dwarf mosaic, pea seed-borne mosaic, iris mild mosaic, stalice Y, celery mosaic, cowpea aphid-borne mosaic, potato A, watermelon mosaic 2, plum pox, sweet potato feathery mottle and white lupin mosaic potyviruses. Reacts best with coat protein subunit rather than intact virion. Vial contains 70 ul ascitic fluid and should be stored at -20°C or lower.
