Description

Source: Human adenovirus 1

Designation: Genomic DNA from Human adenovirus 1 strain Adenoid 71 [ATCC® VR-1™]

Description: Viral nucleic acids, including virus genomic DNA, in total DNA isolated from A549 cells (ATCC® CCL-185™) infected with Human adenovirus 1 strain Adenoid 71 (ATCC® VR-1™). Virus and host cells are also available through the ATCC® Catalog. This product was prepared using methods known to inactivate viruses.

Note: DNA isolated from virally infected cells is appropriate for PCR and other molecular virology applications.

Batch-Specific Information

Quality Control Information

1. Store at -20°C or colder. -80°C or vapor-phase liquid nitrogen (-196°C) is preferred for long-term storage (more than one month).
2. Integrity is inferred from observation of high molecular weight cellular DNA following electrophoresis of 20 µL of product on a 0.8% agarose gel, visualized by ethidium bromide staining.
3. Functional activity is demonstrated by PCR amplification of a 500-3,000 bp amplicon using virus-specific primers.
4. Identity is confirmed by sequencing of ~300 base pairs of the PCR amplicon.
5. Absence of infectious virus is verified by incubation of 10% of each lot with susceptible host cells under appropriate conditions for a period of 7 to 14 days.
